Emma Van Wanrooy



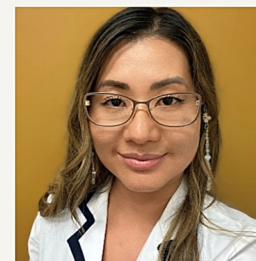
